

Members' Composite Recital - All Saints' Earls Barton, Saturday 5th June 2.30pm. As lockdown restrictions begin to ease, we are really excited to report that we will be holding our first physical event for more than a year, at All Saints' Earls Barton, on Saturday 5th June at 2.30pm.

We invite members and friends to join us for an informal Members' Composite Recital on the Hill organ of All Saints', Earls Barton. The organ features in the current edition of NDOA's *Newsletter* where you can find details of the history and specification of this fascinating instrument.

The Recital will take the form of a very informal 'open-console' event, with everyone who would like to play given individual times for a slot (likely to be a maximum of 10 minutes) during the afternoon. Play what you like, enjoy exploring the sounds of the instrument, practice your music for next Sunday, or just come and listen to the music.

This will be our first physical event since the Spring of 2020, and will, of course, need to follow Covid-

Centenary Organ Scholarships. Just a reminder that we are continuing to welcome applications from young organists in or around Northamptonshire for a number of organ scholarships to celebrate our centenary. The scholarships will award \pounds 100 to be used towards the purchase of music, shoes or other materials to support organ studies, together

Singers can also join for a rehearsal to practise all the music in advance with RSCM Director, Hugh Morris, on **3rd June at 7.30pm** to prepare to join in with full heart and voice on the day.
