Organs on the Beeb. It's good to be able to report that the organ has featured prominently in the BBC's Christmas Schedules - all available online if you'd like to listen to them again:

- Organ Stops! Saving the King of Instruments. We hope you enjoyed our November online meeting featuring the documentary Organ Stops! Saving the King of Instruments and exclusive online discussion with the film maker James Dawson and the organ builder Martin Renshaw. A full report appears in the new edition of the Newsletter. A slightly shortened version of the documentary, narrated by the BBC Newsreader Huw Edwards, was aired on BBC Four on Christmas Eve, and is well worth watching. Anna speaks eloquently about the organ, including her experience of playing the instrument at the Royal Albert Hall, why it has 9999 pipes rather than 10000, and its ability to move the body as well as the soul. - Christmas Services from Blackburn Cathedral.
