NDOA Visit to Oakham and Geddington - Bank Holiday Monday 6th May. A visit to Oakham Parish Church for the 11.15am Bank Holiday Organ Recital by Richard Pinel, followed by lunch (£8) and an afternoon visit to St Mary Magdalene, Geddington, where a new Reredos has been installed and the Bevington organ (below, centre and right) can be enjoyed. NDOA Visit to Ringstead, Raunds and Hargrave - Saturday 8th June. We meet at St Mary's, Ringstead at 10.30am to play the <u>1925 S.F. Dalliday instrument</u> installed here in 1990. We then move to St Peter's Raunds, with its iconic Grade I-listed <u>3-manual Conacher</u>, restored by Nicholsons in 2006, and lunch at a local hostelry. At 2.30pm we meet at All Hallows, Hargrave to experience the delights of the 3-manual Viscount Envoy organ. C V Stanford Anniversary. RSCM is celebrating the Stanford centenary <u>Stanford Centenary | RSCM</u> in style with events and publications, including the publication of an all-Stanford *Come and Sing Evensong* booklet for only £5.95 plus p&p <u>Come & Sing Stanford Evensong by Charles Villiers Stanford - Choral Book (rscmshop.com)</u> - well worth having even if only to play through. BBC Radio 3 Composer of the Week featured Stanford's work recently and all five episodes are available at <u>BBC Sounds - Composer of the Week - Available Episodes</u>. Last, but definitely not least, a substantially revised edition of Stanford scholar Jeremy Dibble's seminal work <u>Stanford Charles Villiers</u> <u>Stanford' Man and Musician</u> is published on 9th April. Not cheap at £70, but perhaps *the* Stanford book to have.
