NDOA Visit to Oakham and Geddington

We then move to St Peter's Raunds, with its iconic Grade I-listed 3-manual Conacher, restored by Nicholsons in 2006, and lunch at a local hostelry. At 2.30pm we meet at All Hallows, Hargrave to experience the delights of the 3-manual Viscount Envoy organ. Organ Reborn - Norwich Cathedral Organ Festival - 6th -14th July. Celebrating the rebuilding of the cathedral organ by Harrison and Harrison, Norwich Cathedral is holding a week-long organ festival. Highlights include Three Cathedral Choirs of Norwich, Ely and Peterborough, the BBC Singers and the Britten Sinfonia, Anne Page, David Briggs, Anna Lapwood and Donald MacKenzie. A full programme of choral services runs though the festival week, including Choral Evensong broadcast live on BBC Radio 3 on 10 July, and so much more. 
