Europe's leading theatre organists and accompanist of silent films, Donald demonstrates the art of film improvisation and brings to life the history and rich tradition of the cinema organ. Not only that, but Gordon Stewart looks back on his long career as an international recitalist, conductor, broadcaster, town hall performer, teacher, and his continuing fascination with the music of Bach - The Organ Podcast (buzzsprout.com). Sadly, we understand that the RCO Podcast series is now paused, but you can find 20 episodes still available which are all interesting, varied and of very high quality.

Scott Brothers Duo Concerts. Members and friends may well have enjoyed Jonathan Scott's outstanding playing at the Proms this year, as well as at the Midlands Organ Day in Wolverhampton. Did you know, though, that Jonathan and Tom have continued to add to their special online concerts, and there are now no fewer than 55 of them available on YouTube through the website at <u>www.scottbrothersduo.com/concerts</u>. Recent concerts feature the organs of Billerbeck cathedral, St Mary's Basilica in Kevelaer, Evreux cathedral and Huddersfield Town Hall. There's also a fabulous Christmas Organ Concert recorded last year at Albion Church, Ashton-under-Lyne.

NDOA Newsletter. The next issue of our quarterly *Newsletter*, issue 1/2025, is scheduled to be with members early in January.
