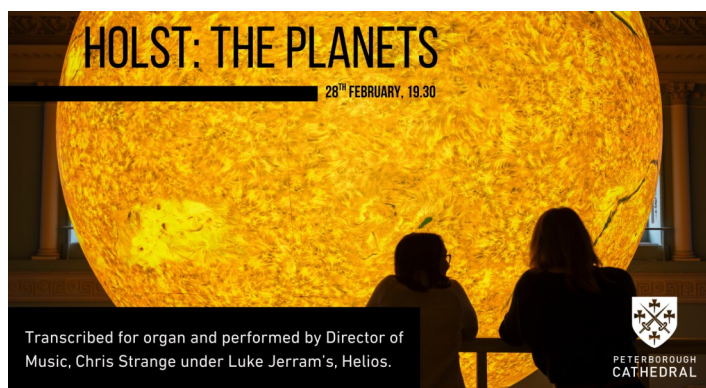
NPOA Eton College and St George's Chapel, Windsor,

Visit. Saturday 9th May. We shall be visiting Eton College and St Georges Chapel, Windsor, on Saturday 9th May. In Eton, we shall see several of the fine organs, with opportunities to play them. In St George's Chapel (*pictured below, after the splendid 2019 work by Nicholsons*), we shall attend Evensong at 5pm and then stay to see (and play) the organs in the Chapel. We plan to start the day with lunch in Eton town at midday, visit Eton College until 4pm, then go to St George's Chapel and return quite late in the evening. People can arrange their own transport, but we also plan to hire a minibus, with driver, which will cost around £35 per head (possibly for a 16-seater) depending on numbers. 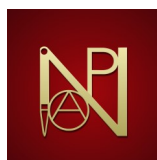

Northampton Chamber Choir Spring Concert - Honouring Stephen Meakins. Christchurch, Northampton NN1

5LL - Saturday 14th March at 7pm. Castle Ashby's Stephen Meakins, who passed away last year, founded the Laurence Lloyd Singers in Northampton in 1959 when he was only 19. He led the choir for the next 42 years, during which time it sang at many churches and cathedrals around the country, and concerts in Northampton and beyond. Now known as Northampton Chamber Choir, it has continued to flourish and evolve under many notable conductors, including Stephen Moore and Justin Miller, both DoM at St Matthew's, Northampton, where Stephen's love of music was formed as a chorister. In honour of Stephen's outstanding contribution to the musical life of the county and his service to the Choir, the Choir's Spring Concert will pay tribute to Stephen. It will include several movements from the Requiem which he himself wrote in 2010, together with other (mainly sacred) music which would have been sung under Stephen's direction. Everyone is welcome.
